**PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

A brief description of the graduate program.

The Master of Arts in Specialized Journalism (The Arts) comprises two separate and distinct journalism concentrations – one focusing on the arts and the other on food. The program is primarily geared toward the experienced journalist, and yet it also, with no less parity, welcomes the amateur. What must be demonstrated prior to acceptance is a strong record of interest and competence in a subject area. For the arts, this spans the critical environments of film, television, music, theatre, dance, literature, architecture and visual arts. For food MA students, a demonstrable knowledge about food, and a socio-political understanding and curiosity about the places where food intersects with culture is expected. For both concentrations, the emphasis is on culture: arts and *culture*; food and *culture*. This program is multidisciplinary and entrepreneurial.
