The Master of Science in Entrepreneurship and Innovation is designed to develop the entrepreneurial knowledge, skill sets and decision-making frameworks required to recognize and evaluate business opportunities and to create and guide a new entrepreneurial entity either individually or within a larger organization. The curriculum focuses on topics such as entrepreneurial decision-making, business model formulation, feasibility analysis, leading innovation and change, and how to access and deploy capital and other resources for the successful launch of a new venture.

Program Requirements The MSEI program begins with a mandatory Pre-Fall course in August which meets for TWO FULL weeks from 8AM-6PM, Tuesday-Friday. Following Pre-Fall, MSEI students must take 6 units of core in 1st Fall and 6 units of core in the subsequent Spring. Students wishing to take 3-6 units of elective coursework in the Spring term PRIOR to Pre-Fall should be aware of the early application requirement for Spring admission (October 31st). Fall application deadline is April 1st and applications are reviewed on a rolling basis.
